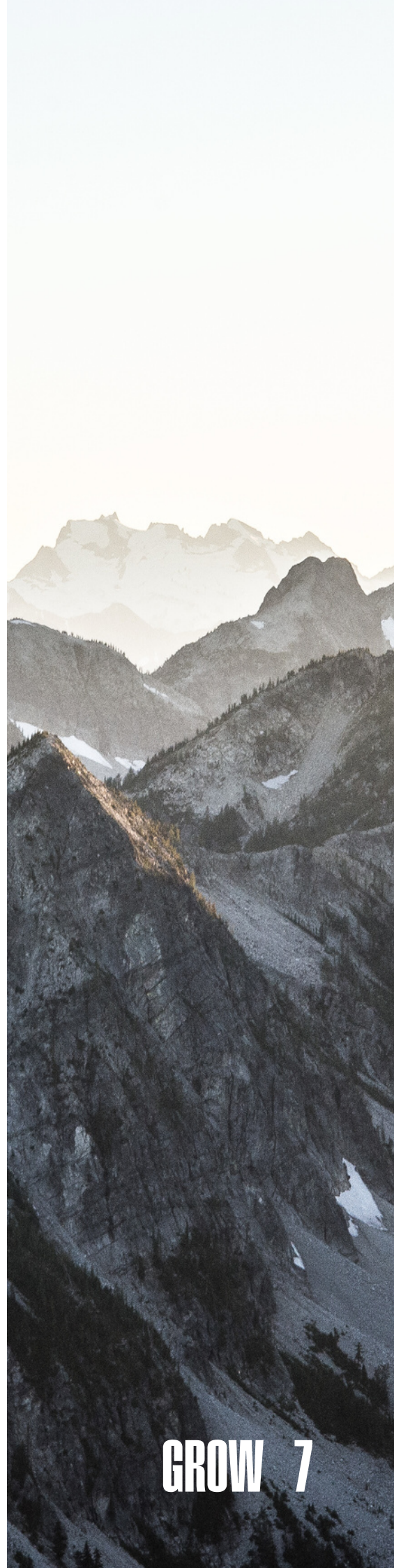
Ezekiel 48:35 describes God as **JEHOVAH-SHAMMAH:**

Hebrews 13:8 says, “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever.”

Here are some other qualities we can use to describe God.

- + God is **OMNIPOTENT**: He is all powerful and able to do anything. (Matthew 19:26)
- + God is **OMNISCIENT**: He is all-knowing. God knows all about you; what you think and where you are going. (Psalm 139:1-4)
- + God is **OMNIPRESENT**: He is present everywhere at the same time. (Psalm 139:7)
- + God is **ETERNAL**: He lives outside of the realm of time and space. He was, and is, and forever will be. (Psalm 102:12)
- + God is **HOLY**: He is completely pure, without sin, and without any darkness in Him. (1 Peter 1:15-16)
- + God is **JUST and FAIR**: God is a righteous judge who will judge all men. (Psalm 96:13)
- + God is **FAITHFUL**: He is faithful to His word and what He says – He will do. (2 Timothy 2:13)
- + God is **GOOD**: He wants and desires only the very best for us. (James 1:17)
- + God is **MERCIFUL**: He delivers us from the bondage of sin and death. (Psalm 86:5)
- + God is **GRACIOUS**: He shows us undeserved kindness and does for us what we cannot do for ourselves. (Hebrews 4:16)
- + God is **LOVE**: He loves us with an everlasting love. (1 John 4:8)
- + God is **FORGIVING**: He will forgive those that ask Him for forgiveness. (1 John 1:9)



Now that you have entered into a relationship with the Heavenly Father through Jesus Christ, you will begin to grow. Like all fathers, God the Father loves you unconditionally and wants the very best for you. He wants you to do His will and be blessed.

Let's look at how we can do the will of God and walk in obedience to what God wants for our lives.

The Foundation of Obedience

- 1) He recognized that God was his Source.
- 2) He was grateful for God’s blessings and gave to God as an act of worship.

Jesus was in agreement with tithing. In Matthew 23:23, Jesus spoke to the religious leaders and said, “you should tithe and also live by justice, mercy and faith.”

ChurchLV practices the 10/10/80 rule:

- 80% Budget for Living**

You have learned that your Heavenly Father wants to provide for you. God owns everything and is so good, He provides for us. Our Father also wants us to live a life of peace and harmony with others.

We will begin to explore what it means to be forgiven and to give forgiveness.

What is Forgiveness?

- 1) Forgiveness - is the act of forgiving; to pardon; the act of excusing a mistake or offense.**

 - a. Many people will only forgive if they feel like forgiving.



BUT DELIVER US**

You have learned that we must choose to forgive others as Christ has forgiven us. God wants you to live free from the strangle hold of unforgiveness. His peace will rule and reign in our lives as we follow His commandments. In this chapter, we will learn about temptation. What is temptation and how can we overcome the temptations that come our way? Who is the one tempting us, and what is God's plan for us in regard to this?

What is temptation?

- + Temptation is something that seduces or has the quality to seduce. It is being drawn away to do something you know is not right.
- + We know that temptations come in all sizes, shapes and forms.
- + Temptation is not new, but has been around since the very beginning.

THE KINGDOM OF GOD

501

FOR YOURS IS THE KINGDOM...

God is greater than the powers of darkness in the world around you. As we continue to study, we will now explore what the Kingdom of God is and how to live in the Kingdom of God.

What rights and responsibilities do we have in God's Kingdom?

Jesus spent a lot of time speaking about the Kingdom of God. Jesus came to earth to reestablish The Kingdom of God here, on the earth.

THE KINGDOM OF GOD

What is it?

- + The Kingdom of God manifests wherever the rule and reign of Jesus is recognized and responded to. It is wherever people submit to the Lordship of Jesus in their lives.
- + The Kingdom of God is not limited to a building or fenced in by any natural boundaries. The Kingdom of God is waiting to manifest in each and everyone's life, when they recognize and respond to the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Who Rules?

- + By definition, a kingdom is ruled by a king. A king has complete rule and reign in His kingdom.
- + It is not run by a democratic system. It is not run by checks and balances of power.

Who is Ruled?

- + The people are subject to the rule and reign of the king and kingdom. In turn, they have the protection and the provision the kingdom and king provide.
- + It is an autocratic rule based on the knowledge and desire of the king.

What is Needed?

- + Obedience is the key to how a kingdom operates. God wants us to obey and honor Him.
Jesus and the Kingdom of God

Read John 3:1-8

Jesus' declaration is two-fold.

Jesus said you cannot see the Kingdom of God. What does that mean?

“Seeing” indicates perception and knowledge. How can you enter the Kingdom?

When you surrender your life to King Jesus, then you enter and see another Kingdom that has been there all along, but could not previously be seen or entered into.

Nicodemus' Answer Gives Us Insight

How can a man enter his mother's womb a second time?

Nicodemus was limited to one kingdom (the natural world) and this way of thinking. Jesus came to reestablish the Kingdom of God in the earth. He was introducing the spiritual world. Wherever Jesus went, the Kingdom of God was extended.

Read Acts 10:30

Jesus Came to Reestablish What Man Lost

God established His Kingdom in the Garden.

Read Genesis 2

- + God establishes His rule and reign in the Garden of Eden.
- + Adam is put in charge and given delegated authority on the earth.
- + Adam is then given the ability to choose.

Satan comes into the garden.

- + He comes and tempts Eve with a proposal.
- + His proposal is self-rule/autonomy; to become like God.

They could establish their own rule and reign apart from God.

Satan says that they can become like God.

+ They can establish their own kingdom, rule and reign over themselves.

Read 1 Corinthians 15:45

It speaks of the _____ and _____ Adam.

The first Adam lost the Kingdom and plunged man into sin, which separated us from God and God's Kingdom.

The Last Adam brought the Kingdom to us, redeemed us and has given us access to God's Kingdom.

Jesus Gives Us the Pattern

Read Matthew 4:17

Repentance is not limited to sin, but literally means to change your ways, thinking and perception – how you view your life. Get out of limited thinking and boundaries, and embrace a life in the Kingdom of God that is limitless and has a realm of all things being possible.

The Kingdom is Within You

Read Luke 17:20-21

The Kingdom of God cannot be observed with human eyes. It is lived out within the human heart and life of a believer who is sold out to the King.

+ In you for you, and in you to flow through you into this world. You are a gateway or channel for the Kingdom of God to manifest.

Jesus has given us authority to release His Kingdom in the earth today.

BAPTISM 601

WHAT IS THE MEANING OF BAPTISM?

1) It illustrates Christ's burial and resurrection.

"Christ died for our sins... He was buried... and He rose again."

1 Corinthians 15:3-4

"For when you were baptized, you were buried with Christ, and in baptism you were raised with Christ."

Colossians 2:12

2) Baptism illustrates my new life as a Christian.

"When someone becomes a Christian, they become a brand new person inside. The old life has passed away and a new life has begun!"

2 Corinthians 5:17

"By our baptism then, we were buried with Him and shared in His death, in order that just as Christ was raised from the dead... so also, we may live a new life."

Romans 6:4

3) Baptism doesn't make you a believer, but shows that you already believe. Also, baptism does not 'save' you. Baptism is like a wedding ring - an outward symbol of the commitment you have made in your heart.

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith. It is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast."

Ephesians 2:8-9

Why should I be baptized by immersion?

1) Because Jesus was baptized that way.

“As soon as Jesus was baptized, He went up out of the water.”

Matthew 3:16

2) Every baptism in the Bible was by immersion.

(Example) “Then both Philip and the man went down into the water and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water...”

Acts 8:38-39

3) The Greek word BAPTIZO means, “to immerse or dip under water.

4) It is an action, which symbolizes a burial and resurrection.

5) The church fathers agree:

“I would have those who are baptized to be entirely immersed, as the work imports and the mystery signifies.” - **Martin Luther King**

“The word ‘baptize’ signifies to immerse. It is certain that immersion was the practice of the ancient church.” - **John Calvin**

“Buried with Him, alludes to baptizing by immersion according to the custom of the first church.” - **John Wesley**

Who should be baptized by immersion?

1) Every person who believes in Jesus.

“Those who believed and accepted His message were baptized...”

Acts 2:41

“Simon himself believed and was baptized.”

Acts 8:13

“But when they believed Philip as he preached the Good News... and the Name of Jesus Christ they were baptized, both men and women.”

Acts 8:12

2) At The Church LV, we wait until our children are old enough to believe and understand the true meaning of baptism before we baptize them.

Some churches practice a ‘baptism of confirmation’ for children. This ceremony is intended to be a covenant between the parents and God on behalf of their child/children. The parents promise to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to make his own personal confession of Christ. This custom began about 300 years after the Bible was completed.

This is different from the baptism talked about in the Bible, which was only for those old enough to believe. The purpose is to publicly confess your personal commitment to Christ. At The Church LV, it is a membership requirement that every member must have been baptized the way it is demonstrated, even though many of us were ‘confirmed’ as children.

When should I be baptized?

1) You should be baptized as soon as you have believed.

Those who believed were baptized that day!

Acts 2:41

“Then Philip began with the Scriptures and told him the Good News about Jesus. As they traveled along the road, they came to some water, and the man said, ‘Look, here is water! Why shouldn’t I be baptized right now?’ Philip said, ‘If you believe with all your heart, you may.’ The man answered, ‘I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.’ So they went down into the water and Philip baptized him.”

Acts 8:35-38

There is no reason to delay. As soon as you have decided to receive Christ in your life, you can and should be baptized. If you wait until you are ‘perfect,’ you’ll never feel ‘good enough!’
